

CALL FOR PARTICIPATION

Expand MTM Experiential Learning Opportunities for Pharmacy Students Create New, Reimbursed MTM sites in Various Settings Including Ambulatory Care

Medication Therapy Management (MTM) is beginning to take shape in the Medicare population. Health plans are able to design MTM programs to meet the needs of their members. Pharmacists can now contract with Part D plans to provide MTM services to eligible Medicare members. Humana was one of the first Part D plans to reimburse pharmacists under contract to provide MTM services. Humana is currently recruiting sites within its pharmacy network to eventually expand provision of MTM consultations to over 500,000 MTM eligible members. Humana wishes to pursue this patient care goal while facilitating opportunities for experiential education in current Humana provider practice environments offering MTM under Part D. In order to expand their network, Humana also invites participation of interested colleges/schools of pharmacy and clinical faculty practitioners in becoming sites for and providers of Part D MTM delivery.

Opportunities to Develop Advanced Practice Experiences with MTM Focus

Humana envisions MTM to be a critical component of a student's clinical practice development. Humana extends an opportunity to the colleges/schools of pharmacy, through AACP, to partner with experiential learning sites in Humana Part D provider practice environments. Humana will identify those pharmacies within its network prepared to provide experiential learning that includes the provision of MTM services and will facilitate the relationship between interested colleges/schools with those Humana pharmacies.

Opportunity to Participate as MTM Services Provider

Humana is very interested in working with clinical faculty who currently practice in campus-based and/or university-affiliated ambulatory care clinics. Sites not currently in Humana's pharmacy network, including all ambulatory care sites, may require a phased approach of integration of MTM services to Humana members. All of these sites will be organized so that pharmacy students develop their MTM skills under the direction and supervision of practitioner educators who themselves are providing MTM services.

Requirements for Participation
