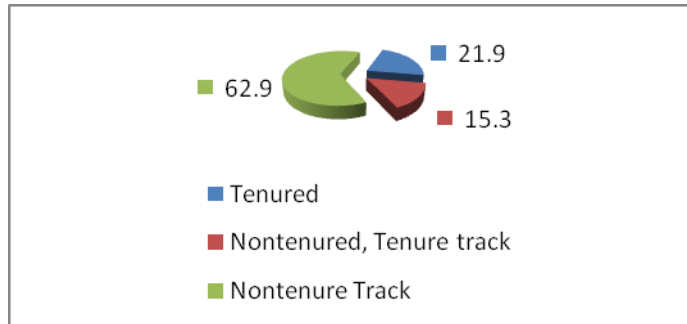
Charges

1. Work with AACP staff to expand the initial assessment of the current membership of the Section as to its composition (e.g., tenure track faculty, clinical track faculty, research track faculty, preceptor, demographics, and specialty interests).
2. Continue to assess the impact of the open membership proposal on the Section in terms of size and function.
3. Finalize an assessment of the transition to dual section membership on the size and function of the Section.
4. In cooperation with AACP staff, develop a recommendation for establishment of a separate Section Website or utilization of the new AACP Website for the purpose of enhancing outreach to potential faculty members or new faculty members.
5. Submit a mid-year and annual report for inclusion in the Section business meetings at the 2009 ASHP Midyear and 2010 AACP Annual Meeting.

Work with AACP staff to expand the initial assessment of the current membership of the Section as to its composition (e.g., tenure track faculty, clinical track faculty, research track faculty, preceptor, demographics, and specialty interests).

Section Demographics:

1. Average membership in our section over the last 10 years is 1265 (range 1161-1490). Current membership is 1384
2. The Pharmacy Practice section is 85% White/Caucasian with Asian/Pacific Islander = 6%; Black = 5% and Hispanic =2%. We must try to help mentor diverse faculty so we reflect the diversity of the students we seek.
3. Gender: 60% of the section is Female and 40% are Male
4. Two thirds of the section are Assistant Professors (45.9%) and Associate Professors (22.1%) with Professors another 12.4%. We should consider the career progression of the members in evaluating programs and services.
5. Tenure track status: 62.9% are non-tenure track faculty; 21.9% are Tenured faculty and another 15.3% are Tenure-track, non-tenured faculty.



6. Continue to assess the impact of the open membership proposal on the Section in terms of size and function.
 - At this time the open membership proposal is on hold
7. Finalize an assessment of the transition to dual section membership on the size and function of the Section.
 - Data could not be obtained from AACP on this question
8. In cooperation with AACP staff, develop a recommendation for establishment of a separate Section Website or utilization of the new AACP Website for the purpose of enhancing outreach to potential faculty members or new faculty members.
