Sustaining Departments of Pharmacy Practice During Uncertain Economic Times

Programming Description: With recent budget cuts, pharmacy practice departments are experiencing loss of faculty positions. This increases the stress on faculty who teach and precept in the professional degree program, limiting the ability of faculty to be involved in scholarship, and negatively impacting on the professional development of both faculty and students.
