Program Committee

Charges:

1. Develop section programming for the 2011 AACP Annual Meeting, and the Section session at the 2011 Midyear clinical Meeting, with consideration of the following topics:
 - Exploration of existing global faculty exchange programs, or the scope of pharmacy practice curricula in schools outside of the US (Strategic Plan Goal 2.6)
 - Barriers to recruitment and retention of quality faculty members (Goal 1.3)
 - Successful examples of interdisciplinary team development, and interdisciplinary scholarship (Goals 2.2 and 2.5)
 - Service learning within pharmacy practice and pharmacy education (Goal 3.5)

ACTION:

-Two sessions were planned to encompass the global pharmacy education and recruitment/retention themes at the AACP Annual meeting in July, 2011:

1) Global Pharmacy Education & Colleges of Pharmacy: Challenges and Opportunities. Sunday, July 10th 1-2:30pm. Speakers: Hazel Seaba, Bob Blouin, Charlie Sands.

2) Shared session with Women Faculty SIG: Work-life balance: part-time and co-funded Faculty Positions: Considerations and Challenges. Monday, July 11th 8-9:30am. Speakers: Debbie Byrd, Nancy Fjortoft; Panelists-Cynthia Raehl, Charles Ponte, Todd Brown, Dana Brown.

-One session was planned for the ASHP Midyear (see Charge #3 below).

-Planning was conducted through email, and multiple phone conferences between the Committee Chair and speakers to coordinate presentations and ensure active learning required for CE was integrated into the sessions.

2. Continue to develop a plan in cooperation with AACP staff to use technology (e.g., webinars) to make Section programming available to members who are unable to attend the Annual Meeting or the ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting.

ACTION:

-Committee requested that sessions be recorded for access by members unable to attend the meeting. The Webinar format was piloted successfully at the July 2010 meeting as a live format. AACP staff determined that the logistics of the live format would be challenging. Therefore, these webinars will not be live, but will be recorded and attached

to each speaker's Power Point presentation. This is planned for both CE sessions, and intended to be continued for all future Section programming.

3. Investigate the potential for programming at professional meetings (e.g., AACP Annual Meeting, ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting, APhA Annual Meeting) to inform students/residents/fellows about opportunities in academia.

ACTION:

- Committee developed a program for the Midyear ASHP meeting in December, 2011. Title is: Postgraduate Pharmacy Education-A Call to Arms: Considerations for New and Expanding Programs. Speakers: Lynette Bradley-Baker, Todd Sorensen. This will be a shared program between our Section and the Experiential Section (Craig Cox, incoming Chair).

4. Develop a program in collaboration with another professional organization, besides ASHP, in 2011.

ACTION:

5. Working with the Section Secretary, update the inventory of Section programming for use by subsequent Program Committees.

ACTION:

-Committee Chair updated this inventory.

6. Submit an interim and an annual report for inclusion in the Section business meetings at the 2010 ASHP Midyear and 2011 AACP Annual Meetings, respectively.
