- 2. In cooperation with AACP staff, conduct a similar survey among pharmacy practice faculty who are not members of AACP. Included in this survey should be identification of the value of AACP membership in faculty recruitment and retention.**
- 3. Conduct a survey of chairs of pharmacy practice departments to determine barriers to recruiting, developing, and retaining faculty members.**
- 4. Work with the Strategic Planning and Bylaws Task Force to develop a specific proposal for making the Recruitment and Retention Task Force a standing committee for the Section.**
- 5. Continue the investigation of the Section of Teachers of Chemistry's mentoring program, giving recommendations on how this model might work for the Pharmacy Practice Section.**
