Report presented at the Global SIG Business Meeting

Global SIG: Rosalie Sagraves (Liaison to the Task Force)

- The Task Force charges for 2009-2010:
  1. Establish a working relationship with the Global Pharmacy Education SIG for the development of joint programming and resources related to global pharmacy education.
  2. Review the *FIP Global Framework for Quality of Pharmacy Education* and similar documents to identify specific issues for further study or programming in global pharmacy education that relate to pharmacy practice.
  3. Submit a mid-year and annual report for inclusion in the Section (Section of Teachers of Pharmacy Practice) business meetings at the 2009 ASHP Midyear and 2010 AACP Annual Meeting.
  
- The following were accomplished:
  1. Concerning Item 1 above:
    - a. The Task Force worked with the Global SIG liaison, Rosalie Sagraves, and discussed ways that the two groups could work to advance global pharmacy education.
    - b. The Task Force worked on ideas for programming for the AACP Annual Meeting and Dee Dugan spoke with Hazel Seaba, 2009-10 Global SIG Program Chair, concerning potential topics.
    - c. Task Force members also developed a draft copy of potential objectives for Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPEs) that could be used in global pharmacy education in conjunction with other objectives already in place for domestic use.  
*Note:* Global SIG members will be invited to comment on these objectives via the Global SIG listserv sometime after the AACP Annual Meeting.
  2. Concerning Item 2 above:
    - a. Task Force members were given copies of the *FIP Global Framework for Quality of Pharmacy Education* by Chair, Dee Dugan. Thereafter, they discussed the document and identified issues for further study or programming.
    - b. Task Force members then developed seven possible avenues to advance Charge 2.
  3. Concerning Item 3 above:

Chair Dugan submitted all needed Task Force Reports to the Chair of the Section of Teachers of Pharmacy Practice.
  
- Follow-up:

1. The Global SIG should continue to work with the Section of Teachers of Pharmacy Practice to advance global pharmacy education. This could be accomplished if the Section has a committee or task force in this area in the future. Rosalie Sagraves will contact the 2010-11 Section Chair to determine if there will be a formal global pharmacy education committee or task force with which the Global SIG might work.
2. Ask Global SIG members to comment on objectives for global APPEs that were drafted by the Task Force.
