Implementation Notes:

- 1) Over two days, we run 25 groups (95-100 students) with this schedule. We strictly adhere to the schedule in order to get everyone through in a consistent manner.
- 2) Simulation and de-briefing occur in different rooms to allow us to keep the simulations running almost constantly.
- 3) Transition time (5 minutes) between activities is important for purposes of re-staging the room and re-setting the computer software. Our staging area, simulation suite and de-briefing room are close enough to each other that 5 minutes works well.
- 4) Faculty and support staff required during simulation:
 - a. Minimum - two faculty facilitators. One faculty observes his/her group during the simulation and then leads the de-briefing session for the same group. Meanwhile, the second faculty member starts with the next group. Ideally, three facilitators should be used so that breaks can be built in and exhaustion is avoided!
 - b. Minimum – one simulation technician to run the simulation. Ideally – two.
- 5) Other things to consider – time for room set-up, tear down, preparation of props, supplies, training for facilitators, grading etc etc...
