There are two documents. One contains databases to which UF subscribes and the 2nd one is a list of free websites that you might find useful after you graduate, including ones that contain free full-text journal articles.

- **Databases** - UF subscribes to a list of 10 databases that are useful in pharmacy research. It does include PubMed, which is free.
- **Free Websites** - Free websites that are useful to look at include the databases listed on this slide. Some of these are full-text. Double check the drug information sites for the authoritativeness & reliability.

**ClinicalTrials.gov**  
This is a free database of both federally and privately funded clinical trials that use human volunteers. It includes each trial's purpose, who may participate, locations, and phone numbers. It also tells whether the investigators are still recruiting volunteers.

**DailyMed**  
This database contains information from the FDA official drug labels for over 3000 approved prescription drugs. It does not contain all prescription drugs at this time, but new ones are continuously being added. The official FDA label information can be printed from this site. This database is produced by the National Library of Medicine with the FDA.

**Dietary Supplements' Labels Database**  
This database of labels for dietary supplements is searchable by brand names, uses noted on product labels, specific active ingredients, and manufacturers. It includes warnings and recalls issued by the FDA and is linked to information from other resources such as PubMed and MedlinePlus.
