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About the AACP Curriculum Quality Surveys

Graduating Student, Alumni, and Faculty surveys were initiated and designed by the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy/Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education Task Force on Assessment and Accreditation in 2002. These quality perception surveys were intended to gather information on program issues and curriculum quality. With the release of ACPE's Standards 2007, the AACP Institutional Research and Assessment Committee (IRAC), AACP staff, and an external consultant revised the three surveys and created a Preceptor survey. The purpose of the revised surveys is to help member colleges and schools gather data for both continuous program improvement and accountability (accreditation) purposes.

2015 Administration

The Faculty Survey was made available for online access in the AACP Centralized Survey System on March 2, 2015. As of July 2015, 95 out of 134 (70.9%) colleges and schools of pharmacy administered the survey to their faculty. A total of four thousand, two hundred and twenty (4,220) faculty were invited to complete the survey. Three thousand fifty five (3,055) faculty submitted the survey for a total response rate of over seventy-two percent (72.4%). Response rates per school ranged from 26.3 to 100 percent. 2015 Highlights

Faculty Satisfaction with the Administrative System

In 2015 over 85 percent of faculty (85.5%) strongly agreed or agreed that their college or school's administrators, including the dean, have clearly defined responsibilities. Over 75 percent (75.3%) of faculty strongly agreed or agreed that these administrators function as a unified team, which is slightly down from 77.9 percent in 2014. Nearly 74 percent (73.8%) of faculty in 2015 strongly agreed or agreed that their college/school administrators are responsive to their needs/problems.

Faculty Recruitment and Retention

Nearly 79 percent of faculty (78.9%) in 2015 strongly agreed or agreed that they regularly receive feedback on their performance and nearly 76 percent (75.8%) strongly agreed or agreed that this feedback is effective. Seventy one percent (71.0%) of faculty strongly agreed or agreed that their college/school consistently applies promotion and/or tenure policies and procedures.

Faculty Development and Academic Roles

Nearly 72 percent (71.9%) of faculty strongly agreed or agreed that they receive adequate guidance on career development, which remained flat from 2014. Over 90 percent (90.4%) of faculty strongly agreed or agreed that programs are available to improve their teaching and to facilitate student learning, up from 88.5 percent in 2014. The majority of faculty reported that they strongly agree or agree that their time spent on teaching, research, service, and clinical service is appropriate. However, nearly 35 percent (34.6%) faculty felt they spend too little time on research.

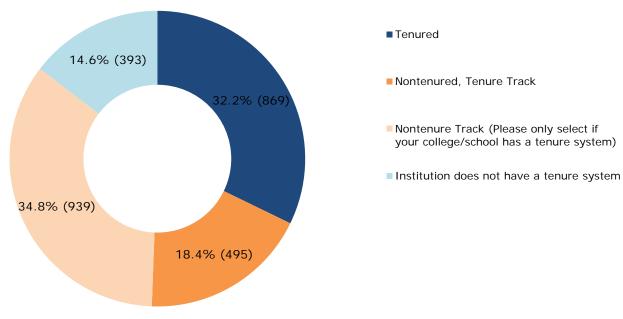
