Pharmacy Demand Report (PDR) Executive Summary

2nd Quarter 2021

This is the executive summary of the Pharmacy Demand Report (PDR) for the second quarter 2021. An overview of the PDR can be found [online](#).

Pharmacists

There have been 8,207 job postings for pharmacists through the first half of 2021. Highlights for pharmacist job postings for 2021 include:

- 4,643 job postings were reported for the first quarter (which includes carry over postings from 2020) and 3,569 postings were reported for the second quarter;
- The highest number of job postings were in the southern part of the country, followed by the west, midwest, and northeast;
- California had the highest number of job postings (1,192), followed by Florida (755), Texas (601), Illinois (3705), Ohio (355), and New York (352). Vermont (9), Puerto Rico (11) and Wyoming (11) had the lowest number of job postings;
- The MSAs with the highest number of job postings in the first quarter were New York-Newark, Los Angeles, and Miami-Fort Lauderdale. The MSAs with the highest number of job postings in the second quarter were Los Angeles, New York-Newark, and Chicago; and
- The highest number of postings were for the Clinical Pharmacist position (3,060) followed by Retail Pharmacist position (2,636), the Other Pharmacist Occupations category (1,544), Hospital Pharmacist position (560), and Pharmacy Director position (407).

Pharmacy Technicians

There were 91,355 job postings for pharmacy technicians through the first half of 2021. Highlights for pharmacy technicians job postings for 2021 include:

- 59,409 job postings were reported for the first quarter (includes carry over postings from 2020) and 36,507 were reported for the second quarter;
- The highest number of job postings were in the southern part of the country, followed by the west, midwest, and northeast;
- California had the highest number of job postings (9,824) followed by Texas (7,798), Florida (6,747), Arizona (4,425), and Ohio (4,202). Wyoming had the lowest number of job postings (80); and
- Phoenix, New York-Newark, and Los Angeles had the highest number of job postings for the first quarter. New York-Newark, Los Angeles and Dallas-Fort Worth had the highest numbers of job postings for the second quarter.
